A Guide to Reports for Parents

RATIONALE:

The Macleans College Board of Trustees will make available to students, parents and caregivers honest and open feedback on students' progress through a clearly identified reporting system.

PURPOSES:

- 1 To provide formative assessment feedback to students as they progress.
- 2 To provide summative assessment feedback to students and parents/caregivers at regular intervals.
- 3 To provide information to parents/caregivers on students' extra-curricular participation.
- 4 To provide a summative record of students' achievements for school archives to:
 - a) Assist in future placement of students in appropriate courses.
 - b) Provide records of achievement for student leavers.
 - c) Provide a testimonial for senior student leavers.

Senior Reports include years 11, 12 and 13.

Junior Reports include year 9 and 10.

All reports include an absent check and a median where appropriate.

Reporting on Attainment

CIE

For CIE the attainment is reported as a percentage mark. Sometimes the mark on the report is not the raw mark a student received in a test or exam. There is also a median which is calculated across the whole subject.

NCEA

Until a student has sat an internal, the marks on reports are a progress grade only. To help students and parents gauge how close they are to a grade boundary we use a 7 point scale for progress grades.

M Cert (Year 11) and Junior Reports

The Macleans Certificate and Junior Reports are graded in 2 ways: Either using an 8 point scale or a 5 point scale. Subjects using a 5 point scale are marked with *.

Diligence Grades

Diligence grades measure the effort a student exudes in their attitude to their studies; in class and independently. There are four areas of this which are reported on.

- Attitude Attitude to Learning,
- Homework Homework and Assignments.
- Preparedness for learning.
- Record of learning Standard of Bookwork.

There are 4 levels: Gold, Silver, Bronze and Red.



Diligence Grade Summary.			
GOLD - Exemplary	Exemplary – The student always does their best and consistently strives to reach their potential. The student is well organised, has a high level of self-discipline and sets themselves clear goals.		
SILVER – Highly Commendable	Highly Commendable - The student is motivated and well organised. They have positive and purposeful approach to their studies and eagerly look for ways to improve their performance.		
BRONZE – Working Well	Working Well - The student is generally motivated and organised. They mostly have a positive approach to their study but should ensure more consistency in their performance. Usually self-disciplined.		
RED – Improvement Needed	Needs Improvement - The student is inconsistent in academic studies and needs to improve their attitude, punctuality and work output. A lack of self-discipline is spoiling their chances of reaching their potential.		

Accessing Reports

Reports are available through the parent portal for parents and students to view. They require their ID number and password to view. Parents will be notified of the dates reports will be available on the portal.
